In 1688, the first formal protest against slavery was made, but it was not until the late 1770's that the Society would take steps against those members who persisted in holding slaves. The Friends also took measures to educate and aid the freed slaves. Boyer's addenda includes information on New Jersey statutes as regards slavery.

West Jersey & Lotteries

By Charles S. Boyer

60 typewritten pages

History of lotteries in New Jersey, including public lotteries, church lotteries, educational lotteries, and private lotteries. Lotteries existed during colonial times and became popular again after the Revolution. The lotteries were sanctioned by the different groups to raise money. Mr. Boyer examines each type of lottery with respect as to who would benefit, how they were set up and what they expected to raise. Among the public lotteries was the New Jersey Provincial Lottery to recoup money spent to purchase land from Indians. Other public lotteries were conducted to raise funds to build lighthouses and municipal buildings, bridges, roads, wharves, and improvements on waterways. The federal government conducted the United States Lottery beginning in 1776, to help finance the Revolution. Church lotteries were usually conducted to raise funds for the building or rebuilding of church buildings. Boyer covers those offered by St. Mary's P. E. Church in Burlington; Rahway Church; St. John's P. E. Church, Elizabethtown; Presbyterian Church, New Providence; Presbyterian Church, Hanover; Presbyterian Church, Amwell; Christ's P. E. Church, New Brunswick; Trinity P. E. Church, Newark; St. Michael's P. E. Church, Trenton; Baptist Church, Bordentown; Presbyterian Church, Metuchen; Campingtown Presbyterian Church; Presbyterian Church, Trenton; Presbyterian Church Springfield; St. Thomas P. E. Church, Alexandria (Kingwood); Dutch Reformed Church, Millstone; St. Peter's P. E. Church, Freehold; churches in Princeton, New Brunswick, Newton, Bridgeton, Bound Brook, Parsippany, and Middleton Point, Woodbridge, Caldwell, St. James P. E. in Piscataway; Meetinghouse in Tuckerton (Clamtown); St. Peter's P. E. in Spotswood; Lutheran Church, Bedminster, Hackensack; and Christ's P. E. Church in Shrewsbury; Reformed Protestant Dutch Church, Acquackanonk; and St. Peter's P. E. in Perth Amboy. All sects conducted lotteries except the Quakers.

Educational lotteries were conducted to raise money for buildings, funds for professors. Schools include the College of New Jersey (Princeton); a grammar school in Trenton; the Newark Academy; academies in Burlington, Trenton, Woodbury, Salem, Hackensack, Orangedale, and Middletown; and a school at Mine Hill, Burlington County.

Private or charity lotteries were held to sell land or wares items, to pay off debts. Among the charity of private lotteries were the Simon Sourmain or John Stevens, Peter Cochran, Johannes TenBrock, Peter Bodine, John Noe, Jr.; Peter Gordon, William Dunlap, Alexander, Powles Hook Race Track, William Ellsworth, Bridgewater, John Dunlap, Young's Weed, Aaron Burnett, Lord Stirling (William Alexander), Sommerville Lottery and Atlantic City Lottery. Includes information on a Committee of Correspondence from Gloucester County, members of which were Robert Friend Price, John Hinchman, Samuel Harrison, John Cooper, John Sparks, James Hinchman, Joseph Ellis, Samuel Clement, Joseph Hugg, Isaac Mickle, Joseph Morgan, Thomas Clark, and Isaac Tomlinson. This committee also agreed to raise money in support of their "brethren in Boston." Other committees formed were a committee of Observation. After the meeting of the First Assembly met a law was passed requiring an oath of allegiance. Because of their religious restrictions on taking oaths, some Friends were jailed for refusing. Contains a list of names of those who were tried for treason for joining the British army.

Financial institutions covered are: the State Bank of Camden, established 1812, with information on the early commissioners, assets; the Farmer's and Merchant's Bank, established in 1855; the Camden Insurance and Safe Deposit and Trust Company, chartered in 1873; Camden National Bank opened in 1885; New Jersey Safe Deposit and Trust company was incorporated in 1889; the Central Trust company, incorporated in 1891; the Security Trust Company, chartered in 1868, but did not start operations until 1892; the West Jersey Trust Company, incorporated in 1906; the Broadway Trust Company, incorporated in 1907; the Merchants Trust Company, organized in 1911; Parkside Trust Company, incorporated in 1917; and Camden Clearinghouse, opened in 1918. Among the insurance companies covered are: Camden Insurance Company, chartered in 1832; Camden mutual Fire Insurance Company, incorporated in 1841; the Trade Insurance Company; and the New Jersey Fire, Marine and Inland Insurance Company.
